Sync Up: Observatories and the Train Wreck That Changed Time Thursday, August 7, 6 PM

Observatories are more than places to look up into the stars; they play an integral role as time keeping centers. Francine Jackson, Staff Astronomer at Brown University's Ladd Observatory, will share the fascinating story of the Providence and Worcester Railroad train wreck that "changed time" as we know it and established a critical responsibility for observatory work.
